### **BUILDING UPDATE**

We are getting much closer to the official handover of the building and we are all very excited! The large structural fence was removed on Tuesday and bunting has been put up in its place to continue to reduce access in or around the building. We are still a week or two away from final completion and look forward to our first Come and Try afternoon on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> September 3:30 – 5:30pm for any interested students and families to come along and hear more about our Secondary offering beginning in 2022.

As was announced in a letter sent home a few weeks ago, Jasmine Clark has been appointed as the lead teacher in 7-9 from 2022. We will undertake further employment processes as the year progresses as part of normal planning procedures within the school. I look forward to sharing any new staffing news as this comes to hand. In the meantime we congratulate Jaz on this exciting position.

### **ENROLMENTS FOR 2022**

We are currently mapping out how 2022 will look for our school. We would appreciate any anticipated changes in enrolments to be communicated to the front office as soon as possible.

We are open for enrolments in all year levels from Reception to Year 8.

We ask that an Application for Enrolment form be filled out for any new children starting in 2022 in any year level. (For Receptions this includes both at the beginning of the year and mid-year intake). Enrolment packs can be picked up from the front office at any time.

Please be aware that we have a **TWO INTAKE POLICY for Reception.**Please see below the relevant dates and school intakes for new Receptions:

- The criteria for starting Reception on the first day of school in **Term** 1 continues to be that the child will attain the age of 5 on or before 30<sup>th</sup> April in that year.
- The criteria for starting Reception on the first day of school in **Term** is that the child will have attained the age of 5 on or before 31<sup>st</sup>
   October in that year.
- Children starting in Reception in Term 3 will have a minimum of 6 terms in Reception
- Children whose birthday falls between 1 November and 31
  December are not eligible to commence school before the
  following year.

### **CHINA IMMERSION DAY**

A reminder that this Friday we have our annual China Immersion Day, this is a fun day where we celebrate and explore Chinese culture throughout the day. It is an extension of the learning that is undertaken in our weekly Chinese lessons. Students are encouraged to wear red on Friday and they can order lunch (Chinese Banquet and a Fruit box) for \$5. This can be pre-ordered or purchased on the day. Activities on Friday will be focussed on the Arts with students learning to paint Pandas, making their own Terracotta Warriors out of clay and decorating Chinese fans and lanterns. We look forward to immersing ourselves in Chinese cultural activities and learning on Friday.
