

SUN SMART POLICY - HATS

The beginning of Term 4 means that all children are required to wear a hat when playing or learning outside according to our Sun Smart Policy. If a child does not have a hat then **'No hat. No play'** applies. Please see the below excerpt from our school's Sun Smart Policy:

The Principal will:

- Ensure that all staff, children, parent/carers are aware of the School's Sun Smart Policy.
- Inform parents/carers of the Sun Smart Policy via the newsletter and website.

All Staff members will:

- Wear an appropriate hat when participating in any school outdoor activity including yard duty in Term 1 & Term 4.
- Model appropriate Sun Smart behaviour.
- Ensure that all children wear a school hat whenever they are involved in outdoor school activities in Term 1 & Term 4.
- Whenever possible all outdoor activities will be scheduled out of high risk times.
- Encourage children to apply sunscreen before they come to school each day and prior to lunch in Term 1 & Term 4.
- Ensure that skin cancer prevention education is included in the curriculum across all year levels.
- Ensure that the 'No hat. No play' rule is enforced in Term 1 & Term 4.

Children will:

- Wear a school hat (not beanie) whenever they are involved in outdoor school activities in Term 1 & Term 4.
- Be encouraged to apply SPF30+ sunscreen before school and prior to lunch each day in Term 1 & Term 4.
- Follow the 'No hat. No play' rule in Term 1 and Term 4.
- During the winter months (May, June, July, August) sun protection, including the wearing of hats and sunscreen will not be required. Families may use their own discretion in the wearing of hat & sunscreen during these months.

Parents/Caregivers will:

- Ensure that all children have the use of a school a hat Term 1 & Term 4.
- Be aware of the school's 'Sun Smart' policy.

STUDENT FREE DAY

The Board has approved a Student Free Day for **Monday Week 3 of Term 4**, **October 25**th. This day will be used for staff to engage in professional learning focussed on Literacy and more specifically Reading.

MISSION - why we exist



World Mission Month

World Mission Day is on Sunday 24th October this year, and throughout the month of October we celebrate World Mission Month and raise funds for Catholic missions. Each of the classes will be participating in a variety of learning experiences over the next few weeks to learn more about Catholic missions around the world, particularly in Thailand.

Mission month encourages us to engage with mission for children by using our heads to enquire about the reality of the world around us, using our hearts to feel empathy for those in situations of great need, and using our hands to take action for them in whatever way we are able.

The Good Shepherd Sisters Kindergarten Centre

The Good Shepherd Sisters have been supporting communities in need in Thailand for over 55 years, starting in Bangkok and eventually expanding their work to other provinces including Phuket and Chiang Rai.

The Sisters have a mission to build partnerships that promote the dignity and human rights of all, especially women and children. Among the many programs run by the Sisters in the bustling capital of Bangkok is a kindergarten for children from an urban slum where many simply cannot afford to send their children to school. The kindergarten offers two life-changing services for both local women and their children: firstly, the Sisters provide a loving education in a safe place, catering for essential needs; and secondly, this allows the parents to freely work and earn a living for their families without fear for their children's safety.

Run by Sister Chalaad Sungkalurk R.G.S., the kindergarten aims to help children from families in difficult financial situations receive education that promotes mental, emotional, social and educational development; provide a safe environment for these children; and lastly, promote collaboration with local families.

"If the children have a chance to study or prepare well to go to school, it will be very good ... for them. We try to support them, and not only for education. Mind and body have to go together for the children to develop. I believe that if we really and truly help them with love, they will grow nicely and will have a good future."

Delivery of Cookie Dough: Orders should arrive at school on the 5th November and distribution will be organised and communicated to families closer to this date.




