### **EQUITY AND EXCELLENCE**

On Monday all teaching staff participated in a session designed to widen our knowledge of a new document produced by Catholic Education South Australia – titled 'Excellence and Equity: Deepening Practices. Strengthening Learning, Assessment and Pedagogical Practices across Catholic Education in South Australia.


Whilst reading through the document, staff prepared questions to go into our custom made 'Excellence and Equity Trivial Pursuit', where teams vied for the winning position.

Staff then put their learning to further use by writing and discussing what practices need to be included in our 'Agreed Practices in Numeracy' as well as our 'Agreed Practices in Literacy'.

This year I am participating in some training on Explicit Instruction and how this can benefit student engagement and retainment of information, to be passed onto to all staff. We look forward to sharing more information as the year progresses.

### **DATA INFORMED DECISION MAKING**

On Monday all teaching staff also participated in a session designed to deepen our knowledge on using assessment data to inform instruction and support improved student outcomes. All students at St Joseph's School from Years 2-9 complete a PAT Reading and Maths Adaptive assessment twice a year (Term 1 and Term 4) and Reception and Year 1 students complete PT Early Years Tests for Reading and Maths. By analysing and interpreting assessment data, teachers create data informed teaching and learning experiences suitable for whole class, small group and one to one instruction, forming a highly personalised and intentional curriculum for all students based on where they are at.
